

Alumni Spotlight

Doctor Ronald K Browne AM, Class of 1954, is an example of an alumnus who has lived a full life, had an outstanding career, and made a significant contribution to their chosen field of endeavour.

Ronald holds a Bachelor of Arts with majors in history and government, a Bachelor of Education (first class honours), and a PhD from the University of New England, where he researched academic recruitment at Australian universities. In 1966, Ronald was awarded the Queensland Prize for Public Administration.

Ronald's early career was as a teacher and principal of Cairns and Redcliffe Opportunity Schools. He then turned his hand to tertiary education where he served as assistant to the Vice Chancellor of the University of Queensland, before becoming a senior lecturer in education at the University of New England and the Dean of Education at the then Darling Downs Institute of Advanced Education (which is now known as the University of New England).

From 1978 to 1990 Ronald served as the Secretary of the Australian Education Council (Council of Education Ministers of the Commonwealth, States and Territories of Australia). During that time, the Council generated several significant policy decisions including the 'Dawkins Reforms' for restructuring higher education, reforms to technical education, a focus on encouraging more females to complete secondary education and the establishment of the Australian Children's Television Association.

Following that, Ronald changed his focus, setting up a boutique pinot noir vineyard. Ronald and his wife are now active in the University of the Third Age (U3A), with Ronald becoming the foundation Chair of U3A Alliance Australia for five years until 2012.

Throughout his career, Ronald was appointed as an overseas academic at the University of Nebraska and University of Toronto. He was a Ministerial Appointee on the Council of Deakin University and a director of the national board of UNICEF Australia. Showing his versatility, Ronald was also a Lieutenant Commander of the Royal Australian Naval Reserve.

Recognising Ronald's outstanding contribution, he was admitted as a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) in 1978, for services to educational research. Ronald's remarkable career in several fields and a life of service is a source of inspiration. Congratulations Ronald.



"We have a grievance; we do not relish the idea of becoming members of the Old Boys' or Old Girls' Associations; one would think that these were frivolous appellations for old buffers and old dames, instead of young men and women. Why not call it the Past Students' Association?" – **1926 Senior Class Notes**

This is an extract from the 1926 Senior Class Notes in the School Magazine.

Nineteen years later, the 1945 school magazine recorded; "During the year the Old Girls' and Boys' Associations, after much discussion, decided to amalgamate, 'to promote the good fellowship and spirit of cooperation among Past Students of the School." Thereby, the **Brisbane State High School Past Students' Association** was born, fulfilling the wish of the 1926 Seniors.

Our evolution continued in 2022 when the Brisbane State High Alumni was launched to represent our status and identity more adequately, as an independent incorporated association, in the 21st century.



Class of 1973 – 50 Year Reunion



11 March 2023, The 'Paddo'

50 years may have flown by, but the old State High enthusiasm was evident at our big reunion. We met our old chums and former staff and some people we didn't know back at school, became new friends. A mark of a happy event.

For almost a year our committee meetings included decision-making marathons (where, when, how much, etc) and between meetings we engaged in some super sleuthing with hours of trolling through public records, analysing, and following up old contact lists, finding people by phone and getting the word out through our new Facebook page, all contributing to our growing master list. Over 400 students attended with our cohort for varying lengths of time from 1969 – 1973. We found around 200 alumni.

Huge thanks go to **Barry Irwin**, Class of 1961, the **BSHAlumni** President who conducted a tour of the school for a group of us on the afternoon of the reunion. It was amazing to see how many changes there have been since our day. The quadrangle is still there, but quite a few buildings, including the library, which was new around 1970, have been knocked down and replaced with an indoor sports centre. 'The Farm' has been rejuvenated with a covered walkway over Cordelia Street from the main school, and the hill where we watched footy has disappeared. There are over 3400 students at the school now, including Year 7. This is double the numbers from our days. Barry kept trying to move us along and must have really grown tired of us saying "I remember when we used to ... and this has changed so much ..." since 1973.

What a fantastic success the evening turned out to be! We celebrated with 90 people, including four teachers: Mr Jim Lucey, Marg (Davis) Lucey, John (Taffy) Saunders and Bill Simpson (no they aren't about 100!); all remarkably well and enjoying catching up, especially with footballers and netballers. A big effort was made by those who came up for the night from Tasmania, Melbourne, Canberra and Sydney. It was great to see so many familiar faces, and if you looked hard enough, you could still see the teenager in all of us, helped along by class and sporting and drama photos on the walls and in a slideshow (and some very large printing on our name tags). We had a boys' and girls' school hat, and every half hour or so, the names of Mr and Miss State High were drawn from a hat and were worn around by the lucky winners. Wearing a school hat takes quite a few decades off one's appearance!

School captains, **Tim Trehearn** and **Erica Mikolaitis**, each addressed us. Tim sent a video from Cairns and Erica was able to be there on the night. As Tim put it: "everyone has had their share of great times and great challenges over the past 50 years, but to be together and celebrate old friendships and new acquaintances is the meaning of a reunion." There was also a moment of sad and heartfelt remembrance for those who have passed away.

We sang the School Song with gusto (Dot would have been proud), did the War Cry like it was today – and all without the need for cheat sheets! Our MC kept things flowing and we gushed over our huge 'State High' cake. A great musical soundtrack compiled from 'those' days was played throughout the night. There was a sea of smiling faces - the room was abuzz!

The names of our committee members haven't been mentioned. The Class of '73 people know who they are! A big and hearty thanks to all for every little thing you did! Most thanks though to everyone who attended, sent along good wishes and spread the word.

We suspect our next reunion will be in 5 years, i.e., at the 55-year mark, or 60 years since most of us were 12-year-olds getting ready to start high school at BSHS in 1969.
