Outstanding Results in 2022

In another year disrupted by pandemic and then flood, our Year 12s completed their full suite of assessment with skill and composure. We all applied the learnings from 2021 and 2022 to deepen our practice in assessment requirements, focusing on education broadly as well as with precision and ensuring our students had approach behaviours that demonstrated strengths-based wellbeing. This, again, required application, resilience and flexibility. For our teaching staff it meant striking the balance of high challenge and high support. Our students have shown a remarkable ability to learn and to grow and their outstanding results reflect those things that we value about developing rounded graduates.

We are not solely reliant on a single score to tell the story of a student. In our view, this has never really been desirable as we are looking at the student we enrol, how we developed their skills and mindsets, how they made progress over six years. What this has done is to build the characteristics we want in our graduates and how this connects to where they want to learn, work and be next. It goes back to the core of our holistic focus.

These results we see tell a consistent story about very large numbers of high performing students.

Here is a snapshot of our students' results.

We had 545 students graduate. 522 received an ATAR and 447 shared their result with us. To arrive at a full data set, we have calculated ATARs in some instances. While this is highly reliable this should be noted when reading these results.

Our Honour Roll

- students averaged 90 or over in all subjects.
- 112 students achieved six As in their subjects.
- 100 perfect scores were obtained in external exams.
- 1) students achieved the top ATAR of 99.95.
- 16 students were awarded a QCE Award.
- 48 100% in a subject results were attained.

We had a very large proportion of students in the top ATAR bands.

As you would expect, the cut offs for grades were a little different in each subject.

Over one-third of all results were 90 or above and 85% were 65 or above, which is around B standard.

Perfect Scores

There were a remarkable number of results at the top end. Forty-eight subject results were the perfect 100 across all internal and external assessment, with three students achieving two perfect scores.

Two students scored 595 marks out of a possible total of 600. One student studied 7 subjects and scored 692 out of 700.

By subject, the 48 perfect scores for all assessment were 6 in Music Extension; 5 in English and Music; 4 in Chinese, Dance, English & Literature Extension, Film, Television & New Media, Visual Art, and Philosophy & Reason; 3 in Literature; 2 in Mathematical Methods and 1 in German, Physics and Specialist Mathematics.

In External Exams, perfect scores were obtained on 100 occasions: 18 English students; 10 students in Music and English& Literature Extension; 8 in Visual Art and Music Extension; 7 in Dance and Film, Television & New Media; 6 in literature and Chinese; 5 in Philosophy & Reason; 3 in French, 2 in Drama, Mathematical Methods, German and Modern History.



Where did our Graduates go?

The bulk of students typically study and they study in Queensland. We have seen significant numbers, in the last five years, also take places in interstate and overseas Universities. We have seen students in Sydney, Canberra and Melbourne in significant numbers as well as students at Harvard, Cambridge, London School of Economics, Stamford, Hawaii and many other overseas Universities.

501 of our students have applied for tertiary places in Queensland. Some have also applied interstate and overseas.

489 (98%) offers were made to our students and 385 (86%) have accepted offers to date.

345 (71%) of these were first preferences and a further 79 were second preference.

The overwhelming number of acceptances was for The University of Queensland with 261 offers followed by QUT with 129 and Griffith University with 59.
