## **Executive Principal's Message**

To assist in addressing the cost of living pressure on parents we have moved to a Student Resource Scheme (SRS) model and away from the traditional User Pays fee structure.

Our Resource Scheme has been designed to assist parents with a cost-effective alternative to purchasing resources and consumables and/or materials required for students to fully engage with the curriculum.

The SRS organised by Brisbane State High operates under the policy and guidelines of the Department of Education and is reviewed annually and endorsed by the P&C Association.

Only those elective subjects that are resource heavy, such as some sciences, ITD subjects and Arts subjects will be charged a Subject Fee if selected. These charges will be clearly stated at the time of subject selection, so you and your child are able to make an informed decision.

We additionally charge User Pays fees to cover the direct costs of incursions/excursions, affiliation fees, external courses, and extra-curricular activities.

Please complete the SRS Participation Form when you receive it via email to formalise your participation in the scheme and to advise of your payment intentions. Should you be experiencing financial difficulties, please contact our Accounts Management Officer to discuss your payment options.

## STUDENT RESOURCE SCHEME INFORMATION

This fee schedule includes important information about the fees and inclusions for the SRS and User Pays charges. Your agreement to participate in the Scheme will be assumed for the remainder of your child's enrolment unless you inform the school otherwise by completing a new participation agreement form (available from our web site). If you are a new parent to the school, this information will assist you in deciding whether you wish to participate in the SRS.

### What is provided by the QLD Government?

The QLD Government supports children's education by providing funding for instruction (teachers), facilities (school grounds, buildings and internet) and administration (staff to run the school). Funding for schools does not extend to individual student resources such as textbooks, equipment, stationery items and many other items used in the classroom.

The SRS helps parents to source these resources. The school purchases resources at a lower cost due to bulk buying. Resources such as musical instruments can be hired to students to further reduce costs for families. Participating in the SRS also offers a convenient way for parents to source items that their child needs for school and ensures that all students have access to the same standard of materials.

The types of resources included are:

- Owned by the student. Eg. Compass Cards
- Hired to the student for a specific duration of time Eg. Musical Instruments – these need to be returned to the school in reasonable condition at the end of the hire period or if the student leaves the school.
- Used in class – eg. Stationery, timber, materials, chemicals and workbooks – these items will be used in class. The finished work will generally come home with the student.

### The Fee

Brisbane State High School's SRS has been endorsed by the P&C at the October general meeting and is a combination of flat and subject fees.

If you are not satisfied that the SRS represents good value for money on the inclusions you may choose not to participate in the SRS. If that is the case, you will be provided with a detailed list of resources can be found on our website that you will need to provide for your child.

### The TRA (Textbook & Resource Allowance)

The Department of Education provides the majority of high school students with a Textbook and Resource Allowance that is paid directly to the school for eligible students. **Full fee paying international students and exchange students** are not eligible. Please see the back of the PAF (Participation Agreement Form) for eligibility.

For those eligible students, the TRA will be applied to reduce the cost of the SRS or you may choose to donate your TRA to the P&C Association. All options will be outlined in a separate email survey to advise us of your preference.

### **Payment Schedule**

Years 7-9 will be invoiced each semester. Years 10-12 will be invoiced annually at the beginning of the school year. Payment plans are available under arrangement by contacting our Accounts Management Officer. Any unexpended fees will be reallocated to whole school priority projects in the following year. A list of these projects can be found on our website.

### **Financial Difficulty**

If you would like to participate but are experiencing financial difficulties, please contact our Accounts Management officer to arrange an appointment to discuss your options. Onus is on the parent to prove financial hardship. All information provided will be confidential.

### **Unpaid Invoices**

Resources will not be distributed until the full or first payment has been made to the school. Any unpaid invoices will be managed according to the Department's Debt Management Procedures and may result in the student being excluded from the scheme and/or participating in extra-curricular activities. Any unpaid fees will be transferred to siblings where appropriate.

### **Return of Hired Resources**

A repair or replacement cost will be charged for any items that are damaged or not returned.



