

Year 12 Results 2019



Our students have, again, worked hard to achieve outstanding results in their 2019 studies. The 2019 group were the last to attain OP scores, with the 2020 cohort moving to ATARs. This smaller than regular group performed very strongly across the board.

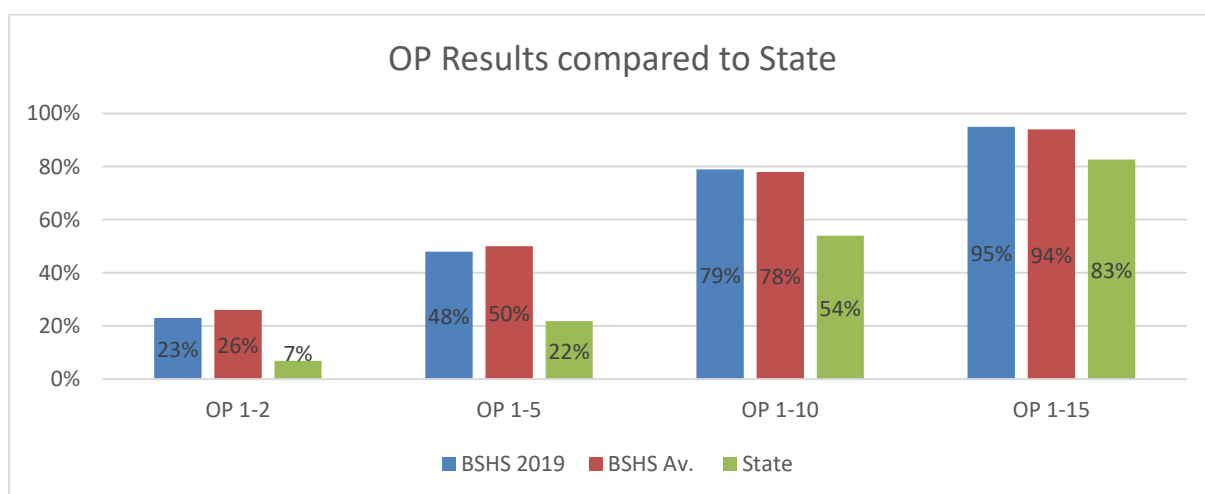
A total of 34 students or 9%, achieved an OP1. Eighty-nine students achieved an OP1 or 2, which is 2%. When bonus ranks are considered, these numbers swell to 121 students (31%) with results equivalent to an OP1 or 2. The percentage of students with OPs between 1-10 was our second best on record and the OP1-5s were our fourth best ever.

The number of very high achieving students is impressive. These are all extraordinarily high percentages of students as well. The median score for the group was 6. Just 32% of the OP eligible students were enrolled on academic merit, while 44% were local entry and 21% on sport or cultural entry.

Over the last 5 years, OP results have been very strong. The number of OP1s was 34, 67, 59, 51, 46, an average of 51 per year, the highest of any school in Queensland.

438 (100%) students achieved a Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) or Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA). Over 88% of students were OP eligible.



The Queensland Core Skills (QCS) Test results were also strong:

Our students also achieved a large number of Vocational Qualifications. 405 students achieved a full Certificate or Diploma, with a total of 512 qualifications achieved. We had 71 students achieve a Diploma. 17 students achieved a Certificate IV, 32 a Certificate III and 276 a Certificate II.

10 students completed a university semester whilst at school.

Of course, these results are one indication of the high quality of learning in classrooms over the last few years. Our students have learned skills, knowledge and values, in classes and activities, that will stand them in good stead as they continue to learn, work and contribute to society. These results are also the means to gain entry to University and other courses, here and around the world. Early information is that over 384 students have been offered placements in a Queensland University on top of those who are moving interstate or overseas.
