AN ARTISTIC LIFE

Barrett (Barrie) George Reid, Class of 1943, was a poet, librarian, editor, and arts critic. Reid was an editor in his final year of the high school magazine *Senior Tabloid*, which from its fifth number in August was renamed *Barjai: A Meeting Place for Youth*. With a fellow **State High** student, **Laurence Collinson**, an aspiring poet, playwright and artist, Reid was the precocious co-editor of this radical arts journal, which acquired a readership beyond **State High**. A bohemian Barjai Group of young people, including **State High** Legend **Barbara Blackman** (**Patterson**), Class of 1945, upand-coming writers and artists, met regularly at the Lyceum Club, and established links with other literary journals.

Among many public roles, he was a member (1965–78) of the Australian UNESCO Committee on Museums and Libraries, a founding member (1973) of the National Book Council, and a member (1974–78) of the literature board of the Australian Council for the Arts. A network of municipal libraries across Victoria was his greatest achievement in the public sphere. When he retired in 1982 due to ill-health, 207 of Victoria's 211 local councils provided a library service. He was appointed AM in 1983. His collection of books, papers, correspondence, and artistic works is held by the State Library of Victoria (SLV) and the Heide Museum of Modern Art. He is commemorated by the SLV's biennial Barrett Reid scholarship for library professionals, established in 2001.

- * Recent projects include the initiation and funding for the Olympic, Legends and Premiership Honour boards, the restoration of the Foundation Stone, the re-establishment and fitout of the relocated school museum, the **BSHS PSA** "Spirit of State High Award" and financial contribu-

tion to the Innovation Studio.

AN ATHLETICS RECORD

Kerry McCarthy (**Bowers**) was School Captain in 1983. To this day, Kerry's athletics career is an inspiration. To win the individual GPS 100, 200 and 400 metres titles for 5 consecutive years in the Under 13, 13, 14, 15 and 16 year age groups will never be surpassed. Kerry was also in the winning corresponding **State High** 4 x 100 metre relay teams from 1979 to 1983.

At the State Secondaries titles in 1980 Kerry won the under 13 years 100m and walked back to the starting line and won the open 100m. Victory also came in the 200 and 400 metres. **State High** won its 13th consecutive GPS athletics in 1983. This incredible run of premierships came to an end in 1990 after 19 consecutive years.

FOUNDATION DAY - 2019

The Foundation Day Assemblies celebrated **State High's** 98th year on 29 July. This year's theme was 'Celebrating The Arts'. ABC TV presenter **Matt Wordsworth**, Class of 1991, hosted a panel discussion with CEO of QPAC and former **State High** teacher **John Kotzas**, renowned music educator and former **State High** teacher **Mark Sullivan** and 2015 School Captain, **Sean McCarthy**, who is now pursuing an acting career in film, television and theatre. **Romy Vuksan**, Class of 2012, joined the assemblies via a special video presentation to share her journey as an aspiring dancer, singer and actor.

Following the Foundation Assembly, three members of the school's 1949 GPS First XI Cricket Team, **John Macklin**, **Robert Miles** and **David Applegarth**, presented the school with a framed photograph of their team which won the GPS Cricket Premiership for **State High** in 1949 for the first time.

Caylie's popular book about the project, *Under the Lino: The Mystery The History The Community*, was published in 2018 to widespread interest and praised as a model for other community historians.

Caylie gratefully accepted the Certificate, and the responsibility it entailed to further explore the rich and diverse stories in her community. She dedicated this award to her Under the Lino community, acknowledging their wonderful contributions towards the preservation of Queensland's stories.

Some of the highlights of Jamie's performance career include performing with the Queensland Symphony Orchestra as a casual musician on a number of occasions, being the soloist for the Hummel Bassoon Concerto with the Queensland Youth Symphony in 2019, being a member of various Australian Youth Orchestra ensembles from 2016-2018, and performing as Principal Bassoon of the Queensland Conservatorium Symphony Orchestra.

2019 Ashes Series Australian vs England

Marnus Labuschagne, Class of 2011, made his debut for Queensland during the 2014–15 Sheffield Shield season. He made his Test debut for the Australian national team in October 2018. In August 2019, he was the first cricketer to become a concussion substitute in a Test match replacing Steve Smith in the second Ashes Test. Marnus scored four fifties in his first four innings in Ashes Tests to consolidate his place in the Australian test team.






