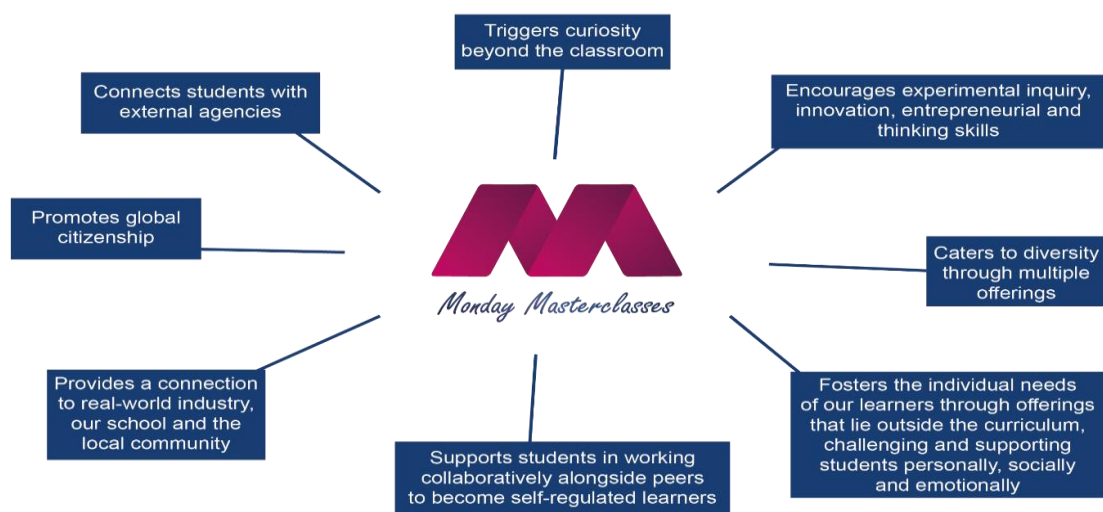

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	<p>Clean Water The Clean Water masterclass introduces the concept of global water accessibility and how people across the globe have different levels of access to clean water for consumption and sanitation. The presentation covers what engineers are and delves into the role engineering plays in facilitating the needs of both developing and developed countries. By providing students with an overview of the severity of these problems in different regions, as well as available solutions, it gives insight into how to facilitate a brighter future for those who are disadvantaged.</p> <p>Students work together in teams to build a basic water filter. Each team is assigned a different country and real life obstacles such as a lack of funds, or literacy. The budget, cost of materials, and instructions given all vary according to the allocated country.
